

## Did You Know.....

The Federal Requirement for CDL applicants to complete Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) before taking a road or skills exam <u>takes effect on 07 February 2022</u>.

## ...but there's good news...

Drivers who have successfully completed a written exam and hold a CDL permit before 07 February 2022 are exempted from having to complete ELDT prior to a skills or road test.

## Your Maine BMV wants to help!

BMV schedules written exams 2 weeks in advance, to ensure enough time to provide applicants written scheduling notification via the mail.

To increase the likelihood of scheduling a CDL or endorsement written exam before 07 February, submit your completed application with payment to BMV <u>no later than 10 Jan 2022</u> U.S. Department of Transportation Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration
