### PRESENTATIONS:

Tim introduced the topics and presenters:

#### 1. <u>Close calls/near misses – Brandon Kelly/Dave Smiley, Hartt Transportation</u> <u>Systems Inc</u>

Brandon Kelly

- Hartt used PeopleNet
- Bring drivers in to discuss incidents
  - Example vehicle didn't yield coming on the interstate, driver could have braked
  - Same driver did brake and avoided a second incident learned from first lesson – driver called in situation ahead of company realizing what happened
  - Give kudos when they are due as there are many situations when the drivers have done everything right and avoid many incidents
  - Great training tool for the specific drivers and others they are training, current, etc situational awareness
  - Training tool, not just litigation tool
  - Good defensive driving when drivers know of problem areas
  - Speed limit and speed of truck shows during the video
  - Follow up on imprudent speed
  - Tim mentioned even in situations that work out for the best, "You can be right, but don't be dead right".

#### 2. <u>Close calls/near misses - Scott Clark - Savage</u>

- Event with many lessons learned
  - Outward facing video truck veers off the road
  - Inward facing camera seatbelt was not worn properly choked on vitamins, lost consciousness and was tossed all over the cab

### 1. <u>ELDT and Changes to CDL Road Tests – Chris Ireland/Larry Boivin, Maine</u> <u>BMV</u>

### **ELDT Presentation – Chris Ireland**

- $\circ$  3000 written exams per year
- Companies can self-certify their training programs via Federal Motor Carrier Training Registry
- MMTA Interest free loans available for CDL training
- $\circ$  107 entities in Maine are registered as training providers Tim said 135 as of yesterday
- Before scheduling someone for written or road tests, BMV check's training records in registry to ensure training was provider by a registered provider transparent to businesses and drivers
- $\circ\,400\%$  surge in the CDL written exams from last fall to February 2022...800 drivers
- Ed Naples mentioned that Maine has been in good shape for years because we have had training facilities available.
- Gerry Breton, Lucas Tree Experts going to attempt to do the training on their own with resources they have used in the past

### <u> CDL Road Tests – Chris Ireland</u>

- To meet federal requirements, some road tests may be extended. Could be 45 minutes but could be 90 minutes especially in rural areas. This is because test must include all require number of demonstrated maneuvers.
- How companies are preparing their drivers should not change.

### 2. Vaccination Mandates – Tim

- US imposed mandates regarding vaccinations for drivers from Mexico and Canada
- Has had an impact on companies that have done business in Canada for years
- 3. <u>Emergency Declarations Eric Adair, FMCSA and Lt. Hayden, Troop K</u>

- Eric Adair, FMCSA
  - Regional emergency declaration home fuels issued Jan 7 and renewed in Feb – expires March 8<sup>th</sup>.
  - National Covid declaration expires Feb 28<sup>th</sup> has been refined along the way – auto parts have been added
  - Companies must use the portal to report use of the national declaration
  - $\circ$  Burden of proof for use of waiver shifts to motor carrier
- State declarations Lt Hayden, Troop K
  - FMCSA is moving to a data driven process when considering waiver discussions
  - o Review the data from questions regarding waivers
  - $\circ$  Make sure you are hauling the loads that are covered and providing relief to emergency
  - May use data collection form in future.
- Tim asked about specifics of providing relief for the emergency
  - Are you hauling a commodity that is on list and is it an emergency?
  - Listen to who you are hauling for. Does the Shipper and Receivers consider it an emergency?
  - Covid driver shortage
  - Make sure drivers know how to explain which waiver they are using and why
  - $\circ$  If drivers are fatigued, don't use them.
